That stated, bet you'd like to know that SSEi recently beat out some formidable rivals in key acceleration tests.* In simulated highway merging (0-60 mph sprints), SSEi showed them nothing but taillamp. In everyday commuting (30-50 mph runs) and highway passing maneuvers (50-80 mph runs), SSEi left them in the slow lane. And in the all-out 1/4-mile blast, SSEi finished ahead. SSEi finishes ahead in technology too. This Bonneville gives its drivers more standard technology than its supposed rivals, with features such as supercharging, StabiliTrak stability enhancement system, Magnasteer, OnStar,** 63 personalized features, and HUD (Head-Up Display).

Pontiac endowed Bonneville with technologies that give drivers near superhuman capabilities. On SLE, driver involvement starts with a four-spoke, leather-wrapped steering wheel (with audio controls), heated outside rearview mirrors, Driver Information Center, a six-way power driver's seat, and standard OnStar.* There's an auto-reverse cassette and CD player, dual-zone climate control, remote keyless entry, and four-wheel disc brakes with anti-lock electronics. In addition, Bonneville received a "Best Pick" from the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety in frontal offset crash testing.**





Azteq's rear seats flip, fold, and remove for "on demand" flexibility for cargo and people. In addition to its range of standard features, you've got options that let you outfit your Azteq to do what you like to do. Hiking. Biking. Camping. Azteq can also be equipped with a number of special packages, plus a variety of custom-designed dealer-installed accessories.

Access from a high-clearance rear liftgate opens up Azteq's multitude of cargo-loading possibilities; you'll find 45.4 cubic feet of cargo space behind the rear seats and up to 93.5 cubic feet with the rear seats removed. With the tailgate down, there's even room for full sheets of plywood. With Azteq's available reconfigurable cargo net system, four nets divide the rear cargo area with up to 22 different configurations. Each net is double-sided to work like a bag. Front and rear nets hold up to 100 pounds. Side nets hold up to 35 pounds. It's like a toy box for grown-ups.





Aztek's available removable front-door utility packs (top of this page) are ready for people on the go. For bigger things, the available sliding rear cargo tray – an Aztek exclusive – installs or removes in seconds. It holds up to 400 pounds and glides right out to you, virtually eliminating the need to stretch and reach. Flip open the tray's hidden cargo compartment and stow valuables or necessities. The tray also keeps larger cargo in place with convenient pop-up compartments. They're up when you need them; gone when you don't. When it's time to remove the tray, you'll find it's light and rolls along with you on in-line wheels. Also ready to go with you is the standard console/cooler (lower right, above), combining a removable CD storage rack and tray with a fully insulated cooler.



Montana's seating options push new frontiers. Start with seating for six as you'll find in the Special Value model (A). The second-row captain's chairs and third-row buckets are covered in premium cloth, and all rear seats are easily removable. The extended-length model (B) features standard seating for seven and a rear bench with modular split-folding design. Leather seating areas are available. Seating for eight, a capability you won't find in any other minivan or even six-cylinder SUVs,* is available on both regular (C) and extended-length (D) models. Both models have three second-row buckets and a split-folding rear bench. As an option in extended-length Montanas (D) the third-row bench seat (with convenience center) can fold down to become part of the loading floor.



Montana's rear bucket seats weigh only 40 pounds and are completely removable without tools. And even if you don't take them out, they can be folded or turned up forward to a "stow" position that frees up additional floor space and cargo room.





Like a trusted pack horse, Montana's always willing to shoulder the load regardless of circumstances. Clockwise from upper left; Montana was the first minivan to offer power-sliding side doors...and the convenience is still there at the touch of a key fob button.* Next, remove the seats from an extended-length Montana and you can carry 4 x 8 sheets of building material between the rear well housings with the tailgate closed. The extended-length Montana has over 140 cubic feet of cargo space, and the regular-length has 133 cubic feet. Below right is proof that you don't have to be a singing cowboy to appreciate Montana's flat-folding rear bench seat...and the wide open spaces it frees up. At lower left, Montana is first again with an available, factory-installed DVD-based multi-media entertainment system.** You also get A/V inputs for video games, computers, or camcorders plus four sets of wireless headphones. Head 'em up and move 'em out.



A HOT SET OF WHEELS. MONEY LEFT TO BURN.SM Got to be good-looking. Got to have good stuff. Got to be with a real-world budget. Got it: Sunfire for 2002. First, rationalize a Sunfire GT. It has a rippin' hot engine, a five-spe manual transmission, ABS, road-tuned suspension, and cast aluminum wheels. Opt for the Sun & Storm Package and you also get a power sunroof plus 400 watts of Monsoon audio system with eight speakers. Sunfire SE Coupe and Sedan both have driver-oriented interiors with analog instrumentation, plus a long list of standard equipment like air conditioning, a Tilt Wheel, and a glove box that'll hold a 12-pack of soda cans. Swing with the SE Sedan and you'll find a 13-cubic-foot trunk that grows, like that of all Sunfires, as you fold down the rear seat. cabin-trunk pass-through. (What you consider luggage is your own business.) When you visit pontiac.com or your local Pontiac dealer, be sure to look into the Sun & Sound and Special Edition option packages...you'll like what you see.

RAW. RAUCOUS. AND READY TO RUMBLE. Firebird is an American legend starring the famous Trans Am and Formula. They come with the LS-1, a 5.7 liter fuel-injected V8 which in Trans Am translates to as much as 325 hp and 350 ft-lbs of torque with the available WS6 Performance and Handling Package featuring functional Ram Air induction. Their standard gearbox is a 4-speed automatic with a 6-speed manual available at no extra charge. And if you want to snap a few power shifts, a Hurst short-throw linkage system is also available. Feed all that through an optional 3.23:1 performance axle ratio and you might want to shop for a G-suit. In case you hadn't noticed, Firebird also rocks with a 3.8 liter fuel-injected V6 with a standard 5-speed stick – no apologies offered here. All Firebirds have cast aluminum wheels, four-wheel disc brakes with ABS, power rack-and-pinion steering, short/long arm front suspension, premium monotube shocks, and... ahem... available traction control. For a different kind of performance, a Monsoon audio system is available on Firebird and standard on Trans Am, Formula, and all convertible models.
